

Student Access

Dear Parents,

Moore County Schools and the Sandhills Regional Library System are partnering to support students' ongoing education. We share the belief that a love of books and learning is a strong foundation for student success and we are working together to provide every ISS student access to books and resources found at their public library.

As of November 16, 2020, all MCS students will be able to use their Student ID number to access electronic library books and resources. We are calling this initiative **StudentAccess**.

Question: How will a student use their student ID account?

Answer: Students will use their school ID number and PIN to borrow books or access the library's services like e-books and online research. The default PIN is the last 4 digits of the student ID number (also called the State UID number).

Question: What can a student do with a student ID account?

Answer: Student ID accounts allow students to borrow e-resources and access library databases just like any other Sandhills Regional Library System card.

Question: *Is the student account free?* **Answer:** Yes, the student account is free.

Question: How do I sign my child up for a student ID account?

Answer: You don't need to take any action to get a student ID account for your child. All Moore County Schools students from pre-kindergarten to grade 12 are automatically enrolled in this program. See below for 'Opt-out' information.

Question: What if I don't want my child to have a student ID account?

Answer: If you do not want your child to have access to library materials, you may opt out. Moore County Schools is automatically excluding students that have opted-out of data sharing during the enrollment process. Please reach out to your child's school for more information.
